

Stained Glass Class With Jan Boettger

Anyone can learn the art of creating beautiful stained-glass plaques and panels. In this 8-week class detailed instructions will include design, cutting, foiling, and soldering. This class is geared toward beginner and intermediate students, but more advanced students are welcome. Max stained glass size of 12" by 18".

(Online) Colored Pencils: Shading, Blending, and Color Mixing With Stephanie Przybylek

In this intermediate-colored pencil class, students will explore in-depth how to mix brilliant and subtle colors, how to develop an eye for understanding how to layer colors with effective undertones, and how to bring works to life through burnishing. Students will touch on relevant aspects of the color wheel and work with regular and watercolor pencils. Prior experience with colored pencils is suggested, but not required.

Knitting Basics With Windy Karpavage

Interested in knitting but not sure where to start? In this one-day workshop, students will learn the tools, fibers, and vocabulary needed to take on a range of knitting projects. Left and right-hand knitting can be taught. Students will only need a pair of size 7 - 9 inch circular needles or size 7 doublepoint needles, available through the instructor on request.

Fun and Funky Furniture With Terri Griffin

This two-day workshop will teach the art of up-cycling furniture. Through the magic of ideas, paint, glue, and other materials each student will transform a shabby old piece of furniture into a one-of-a-kind piece of art. Learn how to decoupage and embellish with a variety of items, then seal the piece with polyurethane to last a lifetime. Participants should bring a small piece of furniture; all other supplies will be provided. Ideas for a piece to decorate include an end table, small cabinet, or small chair. Students take home their completed piece of furniture as well as an instructional printout of the process for future reference.

Intermediate Watercolors with Barb Zuehlke

This class explores watercolor techniques including wet on wet and use of drawing gum. Students will practice learning different triad palette combinations and pulling and glazing watercolors using personal photographs and still life as inspiration. Use of gouache and egg tempera is acceptable. Demonstrations and assistance will be provided by the instructor. Painting experience is a must.

(Online) Finding Inspiration in Anything: For Beginners and Experts Alike With Kayla Allen

This class will teach students how to connect to their imagination by being guided through both non-traditional projects and formal exercises. Students will focus on finding (or creating) their source of inspiration and learning how to feel, accept, and move past a creative block. At the end of the class, each student will have a sketchbook full of thoughts, ideas, sketches, poetry, ramblings, master pieces, and more. These books will help participants find inspiration when ideas run low or a reminder to create is needed. Students will come away with a deeper understanding of their own artistic mind.

(Online) Deconstructing Color in Modern Masters: Hands-On! With Nina Weiss

In this online class; students will study select art historical paintings to understand and re-create. Nina will present an overview of color theory; color groupings, and color contrast. Select portions of paintings or entire paintings will be deconstructed and recreated by students in the paint medium of their choice. Examples of colorists studied are Picasso, Monet, Van Gogh, Vermeer, and Hockney.

Basket Weaving With Heidi Wetzel

In this one-day workshop, students will learn the basics of basket weaving by creating one small round basket. This workshop is appropriate for absolute beginners as well as more experienced basket weavers. Workshop participants should pack a lunch. All materials are included, and tools are provided. Spend the day exploring this ancient art form. Basketry is older than pottery or stone carving and may be the origin of all the textile arts world-wide!

A leporello book is similar to a codex, which is a written/visual book form used by many ancient cultures throughout the world to interpret time and history. Each family or participant will explore the cultural significance of the codex, and their connection to their family's past through the journey of a chosen ancestor. *Open to families and community members ages 5+.*


Take A Child To Art: Mixed Media Miniatures with Patti Logan

Her work ranges from traditional, sculptured, to contemporary. She is often inspired by nature and her sculptures can serve as colorful and decorative highlights for a wall, or a table. Some of her sculptures are utilitarian, while others are purely decorative.



Eduardo Valadez Arenas

Eduardo is a Mexican-American Artist from Mexico City by way of the Coachella Valley. He is currently residing and working in California's bay area. His artworks echo diaspora, his Mexican-American heritage, and influences of California pop culture. His mixed-media works on paper and handmade panels contain elements of cartoon illustrations, sign painting, traditional printmaking techniques, and street art. Through the Modern Codex series he seeks to explore and share the tradition of documenting and personal histories and rewriting narratives. Outside of the studio, his work as an educator has led to collaborations with artbased organizations like Kala Arts Institute, Ryse Youth Center, Riverside Museum of Photography, Oakland School for the Arts, Yerba Buena Center for the Arts, and La Cocina.



The Dorchester Center for the Arts is dedicated to enriching Maryland's Eastern Shore community through high quality, engaging programming in the visual, literary, musical, and performing arts. As the designated County Arts Council, the Dorchester Center for the Arts is committed to increasing access to the arts for all members of our community by supporting extensive outreach and educational opportunities in the arts.

Vision

The Dorchester Center for the Arts is the community arts organization providing diverse programs, instruction, and support for all the arts in Dorchester County.

Weather

If Dorchester County Schools are closed due to inclement weather, the Center is also closed. Check the local TV networks or radio stations for cancellations, or the Dorchester County Schools' website. Classes cancelled due to inclement weather will be rescheduled. Please note: If the schools are closed due to inclement weather, DCA will be closed all day and night even if weather conditions improve.

Class Registration

- 1. Register early to ensure your place in the class.
- Register in person at the Center, or send full payment with class selection to: Dorchester Center for the Arts, 321 High Street, Cambridge, MD 21613
- 3. Make check payable to Dorchester Center for the Arts and indicate class(es) on check.
- 4. Credit card payments (MC, Visa, Amex, and Discover) are accepted in person or by phone. Call 410.228.7782.

Upon receipt of your registration and payment in full, you are registered. If the class is full or canceled (due to lack of enrollment), you will be notified. In either case, you will receive a full refund. Please enroll and make payment at least two weeks prior to the first class. Advance enrollment allows the instructor appropriate preparation and reduces the risk of cancellation.

Refund Requests

No class or workshop refunds are given unless the Dorchester Center for the Arts is notified one week prior to the start of the class or workshop. For all cancellations there is a nonrefundable registration fee of \$15. If you are ineligible for a refund, you may obtain an acknowledgment from the finance office which enables you to claim the unused tuition as a tax-deductible contribution.

Absenteeism

The Dorchester Center for the Arts does not prorate the classes or provide refunds for missed classes. If an instructor is unable to attend the class, the class will be rescheduled. If a student is unable to attend the class, no refund or makeup class is available.

45th Annual Showcase September 26, 2021 Noon-5pm

Now in its 45th year, Showcase is a free outdoor art walk and street festival that takes place along historic High Street in Cambridge, MD. Rain or Shine!

Visitors will find dozens and dozens of booths featuring juried fine art and crafts, along with dance and music on several performance stages. Artisan booths include jewelry, paintings and prints, mixed media, sculpture and ceramics, wire art, wood working, home decor, fiber art and photography. Several nonprofit organizations will have booths as well to share their good work in the community. Showcase includes family activities and raffles for original artisan works.
