

Studio Classes





Beginning Watercolors with Diana Evans

True beginners will see the progress they can make with even one class with Diana. Students will learn which brush to use, the proper water to paint ratio, how to set up a palette, how to mix colors and whether to use wet on wet or wet on dry techniques. Students will experiment with several techniques and produce a finished painting. No experience needed! Materials list will be available upon registering for the class.

Length - 4 weeks Thursdays (1:30-4pm) Session I: October 28 - November 18

Cost - \$90 Members, \$135 Non-members

Intermediate Watercolors with Barb Zuehlke

This class explores watercolor techniques including wet on wet and use of drawing gum. Students will practice learning different triad palette combinations and pulling and glazing watercolors using personal photographs and still life as inspiration. Use of gouache and egg tempera is acceptable. Painting experience is a must. Demonstrations and assistance will be provided by the instructor.

Length - 6 weeks Wednesdays (1-3:30pm)

Needle Felting Workshop with Laura Rankin

Join fiber artist Laura Rankin and explore the world of 3-dimensional wool sculpting through needle felting. Learn basic techniques for needle felting a winter gnome, a tiny snowy owl, and several festive acorn ornaments. All materials provided, including more than 50 colors of wool batt. Students will leave with their completed creations plus their own felting needle and foam pad, as well as a handout about techniques and resources – everything needed to continue the magical needle felting journey.

Quilling Workshop with Joy Staniforth

Ages 16 & up. Quilling, also known as paper filigree, is the art of rolling and manipulating narrow strips of paper and then shaping them to make the most exquisite designs. In this one-day workshop students will master the basics of quilling and walk away with a set of finished greeting cards. All required materials are provided.

Decoy Carving for All with Warren Saunders

Students will carve a decoy using a knife or more advanced students will power carve in the Ward-style. All decoys are completed with paint. A \$75 supply fee is payable to the instructor at the first class for the wood, eyes, and paint for the project. A list of additional supplies and power tools is available.

Ages 6 - 17. Turn trash into treasure during this up-cycling workshop with World Wide Hope founder Griselda Jiménez. Students will learn about caring for the environment while creating art out of a recycled bottle. This class is taught in both English and Spanish.

Students learn how to decoupage and embellish with a variety of items, then seal the piece with polyurethane to last a lifetime and more. Students should bring a small piece of furniture; all other supplies will be provided. Participants take home their completed piece of furniture as well as an instructional printout of the process for future reference. Suggested furniture pieces: end table, small cabinet, or a small chair.


Intro: Glazing & Firing with Robert Gladney





Barbara Zuehike



Barb creates beauty for your enjoyment; believing that good drawing is the basis for good painting and that the observer needs to feel the medium... " the flow and transparency of watercolor or the rich gooeyness of oil."

The internal energy arts consists of Qi Gong, Tai Chi, Tai Chi Chuan, Yoga, acupuncture, meridian tapping, vibrational healing sounds, and meditation. If Dorchester County Schools are closed due to inclement weather, the Center is also closed. Please note: If the schools are closed due to inclement weather, DCA will be closed all day and night even if weather conditions improve.

Class Registration

- 1. Register early to ensure your place in the class.
- 2. Register in person at the Center, or send full payment with class selection to: Dorchester Center for the Arts, 321 High Street, Cambridge, MD 21613
- 3. Make check payable to Dorchester Center for the Arts and indicate class(es) on check.
- 4. Credit card payments (MC, Visa, Amex, and Discover) are accepted in person or by phone. Call 410.228.7782.

Upon receipt of your registration and payment in full, you are registered. If the class is full or canceled (due to lack of enrollment), you will be notified. In either case, you will receive a full refund. Please enroll and make payment at least two weeks prior to the first class. Advance enrollment allows the instructor appropriate preparation and reduces the risk of cancellation.

Refund Requests

No class or workshop refunds are given unless the Dorchester Center for the Arts is notified one week prior to the start of the class or workshop. For all cancellations there is a nonrefundable registration fee of \$15. If you are ineligible for a refund, you may obtain an acknowledgment from the finance office which enables you to claim the unused tuition as a tax-deductible contribution.

Absenteeism

The Dorchester Center for the Arts does not prorate the classes or provide refunds for missed classes. If an instructor is unable to attend the class, the class will be rescheduled. If a student is unable to attend the class, no refund or makeup class is available.
