Studio Classes





Beginning Watercolors with Diana Evans

True beginners will see the progress they can make with even one class with Diana. Students will learn which brush to use, the proper water to paint ratio, how to set up a palette, how to mix colors and whether to use wet on wet or wet on dry techniques. Students will experiment with several techniques and produce a finished painting. No experience needed! Materials list available upon registering for the class.

Length - 4 weeks Thursdays (1:30-4pm)

Session I: January 27 - February 17 Session II: February 24 - March 17

Cost - \$90 Members, \$135 Non-members

Intermediate Watercolors with Barb Zuehlke

This class explores watercolor techniques including wet on wet and use of drawing gum. Students will practice learning different triad palette combinations and pulling and glazing watercolors using personal photographs and still life as inspiration. Use of gouache and egg tempera is acceptable. Painting experience is a must. Demonstrations and assistance will be provided by the instructor.

2-D Needle Felting Workshop with Laura Rankin

Laura will show how to blend colors and use wool batt in subtle ways as if they were paint, building up thin layers to create the art. Chalk will be used to block in the rough composition on the 9" x 12" craft felt. Then wool batt will be used to needle felt each masterpiece! Beads and embroidery floss provided for additional embellishments.

Students are asked to bring:

- 1. Several pieces of 9" x 12" commercial craft felt to use as background color for their art.
- 2. Reference pictures from which to work (ie. a favorite landscape or pet photos)
- 3. Any additional personal needle felting or sewing supplies if desired

Wool batt and needle felting supplies will be provided for a fee of \$15 payable to instructor.

Mosaic Trivet Workshop with Joanne Gelles

Ages 16 & up. Mosaic artist Joanne Gelles will lead students in the creation of a mosaic trivet, wall hanging or tray. Joanne will show participants how easy it is to create original mosaic art. Learn all the basics of cutting tile, adhesives, designing a project and grouting. Prepare to have a good time!

With this basic mosaic project Joanne hopes to open a door for students to find self-expression through this amazing art form.

Decoy Carving for All with Warren Saunders

Students will carve a decoy using a knife or more advanced students will power carve in the Ward-style. All decoys are completed with paint. Up-cycle Bottle Craft with Worldwide Hope

Ages 6 - 17. Turn trash into treasure during this up-cycling workshop with World Wide Hope founder Griselda Jiménez. Students will learn about caring for the environment while creating art out of a recycled bottle. This class is taught in both English and Spanish.

This two-day workshop will teach the art of up-cycling furniture. Through the magic of ideas, paint, glue and other materials, a shabby old piece of furniture will be transformed into a one-of-a-kind piece of art. Students learn how to decoupage and embellish with a variety of items, then seal the piece with polyurethane to last a lifetime and more. Students should bring a small piece of furniture; all other supplies will be provided. Participants take home their completed piece of furniture as well as an instructional printout of the process for future reference. Suggested furniture pieces: end table, small cabinet, or a small chair.

Intermediate Ceramics with Robert Gladney

An intermediate level class - basic hand building experience is necessary. Students will develop their pottery skills working independently within a classroom setting. Class includes slab, coil construction and extruding techniques. Open studio time is available outside of class and is recommended to build skill as well as finish class projects. Class fee includes one 25 lb. bag of clay and use of specialty tools needed during class. Please dress casually, it's a dirty business, and bring an apron and towel. Clay tools are available or bring your own tools (available for purchase at DCA, please notify 2 weeks in advance). Bisque firing is included. Open Studio access is included with all adult wheel and hand building classes.

"the flow and transparency of watercolor or the rich gooeyness of oil."

If Dorchester County Schools are closed due to inclement weather, the Center is also closed. Please note: If the schools are closed due to inclement weather, DCA will be closed all day and night even if weather conditions improve.

Class Registration

- 1. Register early to ensure your place in the class.

- 3. Make check payable to Dorchester Center for the Arts and indicate class(es) on check.
- 4. Credit card payments (MC, Visa, Amex, and Discover) are accepted in person or by phone. Call 410.228.7782.

Upon receipt of your registration and payment in full, you are registered. If the class is full or canceled (due to lack of enrollment), you will be notified. In either case, you will receive a full refund. Please enroll and make payment at least two weeks prior to the first class. Advance enrollment allows the instructor appropriate preparation and reduces the risk of cancellation.

Refund Requests

No class or workshop refunds are given unless the Dorchester Center for the Arts is notified one week prior to the start of the class or workshop. For all cancellations there is a nonrefundable registration fee of \$15. If you are ineligible for a refund, you may obtain an acknowledgment from the finance office which enables you to claim the unused tuition as a tax-deductible contribution.

Absenteeism

The Dorchester Center for the Arts does not prorate the classes or provide refunds for missed classes. If an instructor is unable to attend the class, the class will be rescheduled. If a student is unable to attend the class, no refund or makeup class is available.
